Please take notice that Aurora Township Ordinances and Illinois law give the township the authority to regulate the conditions of residential properties in the unincorporated areas of the township. The following activities are prohibited by township ordinances or by law:

- Allowing inoperable vehicles to be kept or stores on the property, except within a completely enclosed building
- Parking vehicles in the front, side, or back yards, unless upon a driveway surface
- Allowing weeds or grass to grow over 8" in height
- Allowing animals to run at large
- Keeping fighting animals
- Dumping garbage or keeping garbage, junk, yard waste, or trash in, on, or around the property or in the adjacent right-of-way
- Dealing or trading in junk or second hand articles, motor vehicle parts, etc. without first obtaining a license
- Allowing brush or yard waste to remain in the right-of-way in front of or contiguous to the property.

Township ordinances provide for notices to be served upon the owners or occupants of properties found to be in violation with said notices providing for removal or abatement of the condition of the property or activity constituting the violation. If the owners or occupants fail to cause the violation to be removed or abated within 10 days of notice, the township enforcement officer or the highway commissioner, as the case may be, is authorized to enter upon the property involved and to hire contractors, if necessary, to summarily abate or remove the violations. The township is also authorized to recover from the owners or occupants, the costs of abatement or removal, penalties, and administrative charges, as provided by ordinance or Illinois law.
